#### **Thought for Today**

Life requires a lot of patience and trust. The parable of the growing seed teaches us that the kingdom of God grows slowly. Once the farmer plants the seed, he can only wait for nature to do its work. He goes about his days without knowing what's happening underground.

Similarly, Jesus' followers are called to wait patiently and trust, even when they can't see any progress. Jesus assures us that "the earth is bearing fruit on its own." God's work is unfolding in the world, slowly but surely. When the time is right, the harvest will come quickly and decisively. God is creating a new reality in this age and the age to come. This parable offers a lot of encouragement.

The second parable in the Gospel reading shows us what the new reality of God's kingdom might look like. The people of the kingdom may seem small and weak, but they can trust that God is steadily growing them into a large, welcoming community. The image of birds nesting in the tree represents hospitality, nurture, protection, creativity, and freedom. The kingdom is a place where everyone is invited to flourish, both individually and together. This parable is also very encouraging!

The next Film Night, on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June, will show the DVD of Lost in Translation. Sofia Coppola, the American daughter of famous movie directors, wanted to write and direct this story after spending time in Tokyo in her youth. The film was low budget and she had to take a risk making it because actor Bill Murray would not commit until after shooting was underway. It was a box office success and eventually won awards, but it has been criticised for making fun of Japanese people. It describes the cultural differences between Japan and the USA by imagining two people, who are accommodated in the same hotel, both suffering from jet lag and both having to fill in some time in this huge and very foreign, but very modern city. They slowly get to know each other but are not tempted to consummate the relationship until too late. Both Ruth Birnie and I recall difficulties in understanding it first time around. A little homework on Safari or google might make it easier. It is easy to approach this film as a comparison of what can be difficulties in the early years of a marriage to that of later mid-life crises, but in fact it is an excellent "Rom Com", as well as a study of modern life just before the social media era took over.

The date is June 28, the time is 6.30pm for those bringing in their own supper, and the film will be shown by Vic and Pat, for whom we are extremely grateful, at 7.30pm. There will be a short break half way through and we should discuss the moral issues at the end. *Valerie Farthing*






