Update on the organ Harrison and Harrison have informed us that they plan to begin removing material from the church organ for repair on 17th October. The work is expected to be completed during the week beginning 25th November. During this period, the Swell Organ, Pedal Flute, Pedal Octave Wood, and Choir Contra Dulciana will be unavailable. They will try to keep as much of the organ operational as possible throughout the repairs. The components requiring re-leathering will be taken to their workshop in Durham

PCC news The PCC will be attending an away day at Alnmouth Friary next Saturday, 19th October. The theme for the day will be Welcome – focusing on how we welcome children and young people, existing church members, and new people, including volunteers. Our Patronal Festival will be extra special this year. On All Saints' Sunday, 3rd November, we will welcome The Rt Revd Dr. Helen-Ann Hartley, Bishop of Newcastle, who will confirm six candidates. Amnesty The All Saints' Church Amnesty Group was set up more than 25 years ago due to the commitment of John Long to the rights of those imprisoned solely for their beliefs. Marion Anderson later became Chair of the Group and prepared and led the annual vigil, while John Charlewood took over the preparation of the monthly appeal letters. We are very grateful to them and would also like to take this opportunity of thanking everyone who has supported the work of our Group over the years.

But it now looks as if our normal practice of writing letters in the Centre after the 9.30am service has to come to an end. The "Campaigner" section in AIUK's quarterly magazine from where we have been taking the majority of our cases has been discontinued. When we queried this, we were told that Amnesty now believes that their sending out emails for urgent action to us is more effective, usually just asking us to fill in a form online.

We are hoping that AIUK will continue to produce their annual Write for Rights booklet each November so that we can still have a table in the Centre then for writing cards to individual prisoners or their families and support groups, but otherwise it would seem that the only way of continuing with our activities is by forwarding Amnesty 'urgent action' emails to those All Saints members who are happy to receive them by email and show their support by submitting online.
