Thought for Today

Someone once said that the biggest challenge for any one of Jesus' disciples must surely have been putting up with the other eleven – or perhaps, on the evidence of this morning's Gospel reading, for the other ten putting up with James and John. They just don't get the point do they? But then neither does Peter as is evident from other exchanges between him and Jesus.

In the Gospel readings for the last few Sundays we have the narrative of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem with a clear conviction of what is in store for him in terms of suffering and death but despite clear teaching the disciples are unwilling or unable to accept that. They are still thinking in terms of an earthly Messiah who will lead the people to victory over their enemies.

The passage from Isaiah is one of several about the Suffering Servant – an identification which has occupied many pages of commentary with no definite conclusion; is it the prophet himself, the Israelites in exile or the coming Messiah but the message is clear i.e. that the suffering of one person, willingly undergone, can result in healing and salvation for many, a message that Jesus so clearly embodies.



Forgive my hidden faults. 13 Keep your servant also from willful sins; may they not rule over me. Then I will be blameless, innocent of great transgression. 14 May these words of my mouth and this meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight, my Rock and my Redeemer.
