A statement from the Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley, Bishop of Newcastle

It is right that Archbishop Justin has resigned. This resignation does not solve the Church's profound failure over safeguarding and the ongoing trauma caused to victims and survivors of church related abuse nor does it excuse others whose neglect of their duties is exposed by the Makin report. I remain deeply concerned by the letter dated October 31st that both archbishops sent to me and what its tone and content says about the realities of the culture in our Church that still exist. While some progress in changing the safeguarding culture of the Church has been achieved, sadly the progress made by many is being undermined by the arrogance of a few.

As we approach Safeguarding Sunday, this is a time for us all to reflect on our individual and collective shortcomings. We need to pause and pray for the victims we let down and commit to changing the culture of the old school: a culture that put the reputation of the Church before the protection of the vulnerable. Now is the time for fresh thinking and generous Christianity. Now is the time for a proper conversation about honesty, trust, transparency, independence and accountability when it comes to safeguarding and the Church of England, and I for one welcome that opportunity wholeheartedly.

FESTIVAL OF STARS

All Saints Gosforth

As part of our celebration to mark the start of Advent (the lead up to Christmas) we will be holding an Advent Carol Service in our church on December 1st at 6:30pm; this year it will feature the Festival of Stars. This will involve a display of stars, planets and galaxies suspended from the ceiling of the church and lit from below in what we hope will be a spectacular and memorable event. We would like your group to help us by creating some items to display - stars, suns, planets galaxies, etc. - the more the merrier and as different and diverse as possible.

- These can be made of any material and any colour you wish, but the shinier the
- We suggest that the minimum size would be 150mm diameter, but the shape is up to you
- You can choose to make them 2 dimensional (like a paper plate) or 3 dimensional (like a papier-mâché balloon)
- You can cover or decorate them in any way you wish, but you may wish to use silver foil, coloured glitter, tinsel, wrapping paper, etc.
 - We would prefer no man made objects so no starships or space rockets please (also, no Santas or reindeer)
 - The display is to be lit from below, so there is no need to involve any lamps or batteries
- All of the items produced will be hung from a specially installed net that will cover the entire church ceiling - please give some consideration as to how they will be suspended - and nothing too heavy please
 - Space is BIG so if your group wishes to make more than one item per person, that would be great!
