Thought for Today

Why combine a star festival with the marking of Advent in the Church? Advent is a period of anticipation, hope, and preparation for the celebration of Christmas. It carries a profound sense of waiting in the darkness for a light to shine. I believe the heavenly spheres remind us that even in the ink-black darkness, light can be found, and with it, mystery and awe.

Stars draw our attention to the vastness of creation, revealing God's immense power and ever-present nature throughout the universe. A star festival during Advent and Christmas offers an opportunity to reflect on the cosmic significance of God's incarnation - His coming to us as a baby. It reminds us of the immensity of the universe and yet the intimate reality of His life among us.

Perhaps, too, from the Christmas story, we are reminded that stars symbolise God's guidance. They reveal that if we are prepared to follow, we can discover His purpose and direction for our lives.

Just before the dismissal the choir will sing the Advent prose

For centuries, it has been a tradition to chant or sing the text known as Rorate Caeli, or the Advent Prose, during services in the Advent season. This beautiful composition weaves together passages from various chapters of the prophet Isaiah. It powerfully expresses the deep longing of the Patriarchs and Prophets- and, symbolically, of the Church for the coming of the Messiah.

Drop down, ye heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness.

Be not wroth very sore, O Lord, neither remember iniquity for ever: the holy cities are a wilderness, Sion is a wilderness, Jerusalem a desolation: our holy and our beautiful house, where our fathers praised thee.

We have sinned, and are as an unclean thing, and we all do fade as a leaf: and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away; thou hast hid thy face from us: and hast consumed us, because of our iniquities.

Ye are my witnesses, saith the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen; that ye may know me and believe me:

I, even I, am the Lord, and beside me there is no Saviour: and there is none that can deliver out of my hand.

Comfort ye, comfort ye, my people, my salvation shall not tarry:
I have blotted out as a thick cloud thy transgressions:
Fear not, for I will save thee:
for I am the Lord thy God,
the Holy One of Israel, thy Redeemer.
