Welcome to All Saints for our Carol Service on Christmas Eve.

In this service, through the readings from the Bible and the carols and songs we sing, we hear how God, the creator of the universe, has come to be with us. The child whose birth we celebrate embraces our human condition, bringing us hope. We believe that Jesus, born in a manger, supports and guides us even now. His light shows us a way forward in these unpredictable times.

May this time of worship bring each of us closer to the peace and joy of which the angels sing.

Procession

Please remain seated until verse 3.

Solo: Once in royal David's city

Stood a lowly cattle shed

Candles are lit from those on the windowsills during the next verse, and the light spreads through the church.

Glorious now behold him arise, King and God and sacrifice; Heav'n sings alleluia, Alleluia the earth replies: O star of wonder, star of night ...

The Blessing of the Crib

Please remain standing as a short prayer is said to bless the crib.

Carol: Away in a Manger

Children: Away in a manger, no crib for a bed,

The little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head. The stars in the bright sky look down where he lay,

The little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

All: The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes,

But little Lord Jesus no crying he makes. I love thee, Lord Jesus! Look down from the

sky,

And stay by my side until morning is nigh.

Be near me, Lord Jesus; I ask thee to stay Close by me for ever, and love me, I pray Bless all the dear children in thy tender care, And fit us for heaven, to live with thee there.

All return to their places at the end of the carol.
