Thought for Today

Advent Challenge, Christmas Gift

Last Sunday, reflecting on the message of John the Baptist, the Vicar spoke to us of the work of repentance. Very necessary in Advent, and all too easily squeezed out. We can't be serious about the Kingdom of God, without acknowledging our need for change and transformation. "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with ME!" How can we expect to receive God's gifts, without making space for the Lord in our hearts and communities?

But today there's a change of gear. We turn from the severe demands of John to the blessedness of Mary. Jesus comes to her out of the blue, as a pure unearned gift. Mary forbids us to be snooty about the throngs who will flock to Carol Services but who never come any other time. Soon there will be the joy of those who get just what they want for Christmas. Better still, the delight of those who receive surprises they didn't expect. And these will be true expressions of the Magnificat in children's faces and many a worn out heart.

Of course Mary ("full of grace," according to Gabriel) and John (whose name, communicated by Gabriel, means "God is gracious") are not strangers to each other. With the coming of Christ, the prophecy of the Psalm is fulfilled: "Mercy and truth are met together, righteousness and peace have kissed each other." Our repentance may be half hearted, but the reward is Christ, who does not do half measures
