# **Thought for Today**

Weddings are always an opportunity for great celebration and in Jesus' time probably involved the whole community as well as immediate family and friends. Hospitality was a sacred duty and any hosts who could not provide enough food and drink for the guests would feel shame among their neighbours. So in providing an abundance of wine Jesus was at least saving the family from shame and embarrassment as well as ensuring that the guests enjoyed themselves. Jesus was no killjoy.

At a deeper level, as the first of the "signs" in John's Gospel of who Jesus truly is, this story demonstrates that God is a God of abundance and will provide generously for our needs and also that God can take the ordinary things of life and transform them into something more wonderful.

As we meet each week to "celebrate" the Eucharist I wonder – do we leave church looking as if we had been to a party or as if we were expecting transformation of the ordinary? In this season of Epiphany (as at all times) that is what we are encouraged to do.

Last Wednesday the PCC discussed a response to the proposal to end church attendance as a qualification for admission to Archbishop Runcie Church of England First School. This could mean that families who attend All Saints may not be able to secure a place in the future. Your input would be valued on this significant matter. 


