### **Thought for Today**

### **Making Humanity Great Again**

Today's Gospel follows on perfectly from the message we got from Canon Sue McCormack last Sunday. Her newsletter message was a helpful comment on the readings, but her actual sermon at the Parish Eucharist was full of stories of resilience and transformation in the face of adversity, in an area of significant deprivation. It's a privilege for us at All Saints to be supporting community outreach in her parishes, through our "mission of the month" commitment. St Luke's version of Jesus's famous "Beatitudes", which we shall hear this morning, is more down-to-earth than the better known version in St Matthew's Gospel. The blessings of the Kingdom are not for "the poor *in spirit*" but for "the poor." Not for "those who hunger and thirst *for righteousness*" but for "those who hunger." And to reinforce the point, Luke's four Beatitudes (rather than eight) are followed by four woes: "Alas for you who are rich now," and so-on. Which puts me in mind of Patrick Appleford's hymn:

O Lord, all the world belongs to you And you are always making all things new What is wrong you forgive And the new life you give Is what's turning the world upside down

As we enjoy this period of "Ordinary Time" between Epiphany and Lent, let's remember that "Ordinary" should not mean boring. It's time to live the true and proper ORDER that Christ is forging now and for eternity.

**All Church of England Parishes** across the country are required to prepare a **new electoral roll** this year. This means that everyone on the existing roll will need to re-apply in order to be included: names are not automatically carried over onto the new roll.

You will see a notice near the main door of All Saints which is to be displayed at least two months before our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on 11th May. During this time anyone leading services is to make an announcement that the new roll is being prepared and all reasonable efforts should be made to contact those on the existing roll so that they are able to reapply.

Applications are made by filling out the form, available at the back of church. The preparation of the roll needs to be completed by 20th April and the completed roll will be put up near the main door on the 27th April so any corrections can be made.

**Easter is late** in 2025! This year Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, falls on 5th March. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on 13th April. Easter Day falls on 20th April (and this is one of the years when the date is shared by the Orthodox and Roman Catholic Churches). Trinity Sunday, concluding the first half of the Church's Year, falls on 15th June.

**Community Organising** Since November, I have been participating in a national community organising course, with the hope of using this approach, among other things, to encourage church growth. The aim is to further develop a relational culture at All Saints, fostering listening both within the church community and in the wider community, alongside bottom-up planning. A key aspect of this process involves one-to-one meetings, typically lasting about 40 minutes. In these meetings, each person shares something of their story, passions, significant relationships, and gifts, while also listening to the same from their conversation partner.
