### **Thought for Today**

How are we to read the creation stories in Genesis today? With the publication of Darwin's *Origin of Species* and *Descent of Man* in the 1860s and 70s, science and theology became locked in fierce combat as the church regarded these publications as undermining the "truth" of the Bible. As far as the age and origin of the universe was concerned, Archbishop Ussher of Armagh in the 17<sup>th</sup> century had estimated the date of creation to be 4004 B.C. presumably by calculating backwards through the OT record to Adam and Eve. This was easily shown to be absurd and able to be disproved by geological and other types of scientific investigation. As time has passed scientists have constantly moved on in their discoveries that the world is much older, more complex and more mysterious than had been supposed and that planet earth is only one of millions of galaxies.

We would now accept that the creation narratives (and there are two separate ones in the first two chapters of Genesis) were written not as science, history or cosmology but as symbolic statements of faith and not literal descriptions. They were addressed to the question not of how the world came into being (which is science's job) but of why, and what it means to believe that God is somehow behind and also intimately involved in creation, that creation points beyond itself to something greater. Our task now, in the face of threats to the environment, is to act responsibly towards creation as stewards and not to dominate but to preserve.

**All Church of England Parishes** across the country are required to prepare a **new electoral roll** this year. This means that everyone on the existing roll will need to re-apply in order to be included: names are not automatically carried over onto the new roll.

You will see a notice near the main door of All Saints which is to be displayed at least two months before our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on 11th May. During this time anyone leading services is to make an announcement that the new roll is being prepared and all reasonable efforts should be made to contact those on the existing roll so that they are able to reapply.

Applications are made by filling out the form, available at the back of church. The preparation of the roll needs to be completed by 20th April and the completed roll will be put up near the main door on the 27th April so any corrections can be made.

**Easter is late** in 2025! This year Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, falls on 5th March. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on 13th April. Easter Day falls on 20th April (and this is one of the years when the date is shared by the Orthodox and Roman Catholic Churches). Trinity Sunday, concluding the first half of the Church's Year, falls on 15th June.

**Community Organising** Since November, I have been participating in a national community organising course, with the hope of using this approach, among other things, to encourage church growth. The aim is to further develop a relational culture at All Saints, fostering listening both within the church community and in the wider community, alongside bottom-up planning. A key aspect of this process involves one-to-one meetings, typically lasting about 40 minutes. In these meetings, each person shares something of their story, passions, significant relationships, and gifts, while also listening to the same from their conversation partner. 
### **Update from Tyneside Welcomes - our Mission of the Month for February**

Firstly, thank you again for the moral, practical and financial support that All Saints has given to the Gosforth Branch of Tyneside Welcomes over the past four years. Without it we would not have been able to resettle a Syrian family from uncertain and unstable circumstances in Turkey to the safety, security and opportunity of Tyneside. They arrived in June 2022, and you might think that we would be ready to move on to finding another family to resettle. Whilst the amount of hands-on help needed to guide the family through resettlement, language courses, benefits, school places, health needs etc has diminished, we still need to be there for them and there are some tricky months ahead. The two-year tenancy which we obtained is due to expire in June, so we are faced with the reality of the housing crisis. It is likely that the family will need to move to local authority temporary accommodation (though hopefully they will avoid having to go into B&B) before finding a permanent tenancy. We want to be there to support them through all of the likely disruption.

If this all sounds a bit downbeat, I need to emphasise the positives arising from the work of Tyneside Welcomes. Firstly, when we see the destruction, fear and displacement from the various wars which visit our TV screens every night, we can think at least there is one family rescued from a similar trial. Secondly, having managed clandestine border crossings from war-torn Syria to Turkey, and survived major earthquakes, this family are incredibly resourceful, so the prospect of temporary accommodation is not going to phase them, and it has been a privilege to be part of their journey. Last but not least come the volunteers (some from among our congregation and many from our friends at St Charles) who have shown such dedication and generosity with their time and effort, whether it be wrestling with online claim forms or accompanying someone to a school visit or even a hospital appointment on Christmas Eve. It does your heart good just to see such quiet service.

As to the future, the other family Tyneside Welcomes support is facing similar housing problems so it is difficult for the trustees to determine the next step: will we seek to sponsor another refugee household? Or, in view of the considerable difficulties created by the current housing crisis, should we change direction and develop new ways of working with refugees and asylum seekers? Our finances our quite healthy, and while this year's donations for mission of the month will help with the inevitable expenses for families moving house, we will need to have a clearer plan if we are to ask for your support in future years. *Andrew Cole*





