This week we enter into the season of Lent. The flowers have been removed from the church, and the silver ornaments covered with plain cloth. These outward changes reflect an inner shift in mood and focus as we journey with Jesus towards the cross. Lent is a time for letting go: we give up some of the things we normally enjoy. And it is a time for receiving: as we are recalled to our dependence on God, we open ourselves to God's abundant grace. Our readings for this Sunday reflect these twin themes of self-denial and grace. They speak of God's faithfulness, and of our need to be reminded of it, over and over again.

All Church of England Parishes across the country are required to prepare a new electoral roll this year. This means that everyone on the existing roll will need to re-apply in order to be included: names are not automatically carried over onto the new roll.

You will see a notice near the main door of All Saints which is to be displayed at least two months before our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on 11th May. During this time anyone leading services is to make an announcement that the new roll is being prepared and all reasonable efforts should be made to contact those on the existing roll so that they are able to reapply.

Applications are made by filling out the form, available at the back of church. The preparation of the roll needs to be completed by 20th April and the completed roll will be put up near the main door on the 27th April so any corrections can be made.
