# **Lent Course: Exploring the Creeds**


Our aim during Lent this year is to deepen our understanding of the Creed and the role of The Creeds in the life of the Church. We will use a course from the popular Pilgrim Series.

First written in the time of the early church, these summaries of the Christian faith have been used in worship ever since - and continue in use at All Saints today! What can these ancient texts mean for us in the twenty-first century? Our groups will face this question together, working through key topics of the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds. Each session includes prayer, a reading from the Bible, a reflection from a modern writer, and group discussion.

No expertise is required – only a willingness to explore and engage with what we affirm each Sunday.

#### Themes of the course over 5 weeks:

- What are the Creeds?
- God as Trinity
- Fully God and Fully Human
- Crucified, Risen, Ascended
- I Believe in the Holy Spirit

### Resources for Daily Prayer at home or at work

You may find it helpful to use a structured form of prayer with a regular pattern of scripture, praise and prayers. Among the many books and websites which offer this, the following are recommended:

- Common Worship: Daily Prayer contains a simple form of "prayer during the Day" as well as Morning, Evening and Night Prayer. Daily Prayer is available as a book or online.
- Celtic Daily Prayer a book produced by the Northumbria Community; draws on the inheritance of many of our local saints.
- Sacred Space a very simple form of prayer online, provided by the Irish Jesuits, using reflective reading of short passages of scripture: www.sacredspace.ie
- Oremus an Anglican website with prayer resources: www.oremus.org
- ReJesus an imaginative website with many good resources including a short form of daily prayer: www.rejesusbook.com

Prayer Guides from the Diocese: In October 2024, the Diocese of Newcastle embarked on a 'Year of Seeking', with an invitation to spend time throughout the year in "prayer that helps us notice where God is working and to celebrate and amplify what we notice". To help us do this, the Diocese has produced a prayer guide which can be used individually or in groups. Copies are available at the back of church. Why not take one home and set aside some time each week throughout Lent to engage with one or more of the suggestions offered? If you do this, we would love to hear from you about what you discover: where are you noticing or encountering God in your context?
