This week we celebrate Mothering Sunday, giving thanks for mothers and all that they mean to us. We remember the women who gave us birth, who fed, clothed, and cared for us, who taught and guided us, who encouraged and supported us, who loved us, who helped us become the people we are today. We also recognise that this kind of love can be costly, and that mothers make many sacrifices for their children, great and small. On our journey through Lent, this week we walk alongside Mary the mother of Jesus. In our Gospel reading we see her at the foot of the cross: still choosing to be present for Jesus, still supporting and comforting him, to the very end, no matter the cost to herself. In her, and in all devoted mothers, we see a reflection of the love of God, and the life of love to which he calls us all.
